# **Investigate Traditions**

"St. Patrick's revelers thought wearing green made one invisible to leprechauns, fairy creatures who would pinch anyone they could see (anyone not wearing green). People began pinching those who didn't wear green as a reminder that leprechauns would sneak up and pinch green-abstainers." (from the internet where everything is true)

Do you ever wonder why we pinch on St Patty's day? Inflicting pain (pinching) on those who don't conform to the green standard might seem like a good way to get people's attention about the dangers of going green-less. Or, it might be that we just like inflicting pain.

I see a parallel, however stretched it might be, between those who pinch green-abstainers and those who harass others who may not tow a religious party line. Like pinching on St Patty's Day, we like our traditions and expect folks to conform to them. If not, well, there's a handy variety of labels we can stick on them to make them feel the pinch.

Don't get me wrong, I like tradition. But I like knowledge even more. Why we do what we do is as important as actually doing what we do. It's education -knowledge of God- that should drive our traditions and not simply habit. Knowing the reasons for them is a lot better than simply saying, "Well, that's the way we've always done it."

Don't get pinched, get educated. Don't trust tradition, seek God.
