The Disciples' Failure

The failure of the disciples in the last events of the life of Jesus is striking:

- 1. They are angry at the woman who selflessly and lovingly is washing Jesus' feet and they criticize her Matthew 26:8-9; John 12:4-6.
- 2. One of the disciples betrays him for a small price Matthew 26:14-16, 47-50; Mark 14:10-11, 43-46; Luke 22:3-6, 47-48; John 18:2-4.
- 3. They argue at the meal about who will be the greatest **Luke 22:24-27**. Jesus teaches them by washing their feet that greatness involves lowly service to others **John 13:1-17**.
- 4. They over-confidentially affirm their loyalty to Jesus when Jesus tells them they all forsake Him Matthew 26:31-35; Mark 14:27-31.
- 5. They sleep instead of being fervent in prayer Matthew 26:40, 42, 45; Mark 14:37, 40; Luke 22:45-46.
- 6. Compare being "watchful" and "on the alert" in Jesus' warnings Matthew 24:42, 43; 25:13; with what the disciples do in Matthew 26:38, 40, 41. Compare Mark 13:34, 35, 37 with Mark 14:34, 37, 38.
- 7. Compare the warning about sleeping in Mark 13:36 with Mark 14:37, 37, 40, 41. The disciples are completely failing to heed the warnings Jesus has given them to watch and pray.
- 8. They drew their swords to fight to cause Him to not be given to the ones who came to arrest Him Matthew 26:51-54; Mark 14:47; Luke 22:50-51; John 18:10-11. They are not understanding what Jesus tried to say to them repeatedly Matthew 16:21-23.

- 9. They forsake Him and flee Matthew 26:56; Mark 14:50-52.
- 10. The leader and perhaps bravest of the disciples denies Him altogether Matthew 26:69-75; Mark 14:66-72; Luke 22:54-62; John 18:15-18, 25-27.

In spite of the disciple's failure, Jesus dies for them anyway. Are they worthy of such a sacrifice? Are they worthy of the devotion that He shows them? They are not, but he loves them anyway.

Jesus loves and is loyal to His people (even us) though we do not deserve it. That is truly AMAZING GRACE!!
